THE CAST

- FRED SLABACH (David) Since arriving in Starkville a year ago, Fred has appeared in SCT's productions of *The Nerd* and *Life with Father*. He is the deputy director and general counsel of the John C. Stennis Center for Public Service Training and Development. Prior to moving to Starkville, Fred and his wife, Melany Neilson, lived in Washington, D.C. where he was legislative counsel to Sen. Stennis and Melany completed her award-winning book, *Even Mississippi*.
- TERRY REECE MCDOWELL (Barbara) A veteran of SCT and other local stage productions, Terry has appeared in *The Philadelphia Story, Steel Magnolias, The Octette Bridge Club, How the Other Half Loves, and Witness for the Prosecution,* among others. In addition, her backstage work for SCT has been extensive. Terry comments: "I am the 6th of seven children, all of whom are very talented at something." She is a second-grade teacher at Alexander Attendance Center. She adds a special thanks to husband Ledge for "holding down the fort during rehearsals."
- MADELINE GOLDEN (Trudy) Her role in Social Security marks Madeline's twelfth performance on SCT stages. She counts as her special favorite SCT plays The Octette Bridge Club (a statewide community theatre award-winning play), How the Other Half Loves, and Steel Magnolias. An accomplished musician, Madeline's life focuses upon her position as an executive secretary at Mississippi Co-operative Extension Service. She assures her theatrical groupies that "Baby Kitty is still doing well."
- MARTY MORRIS (Martin) Marty assures his friends that his real name and his character's name in *Social Security* are purely coincidental. Following his student career at MSU and his work as chief photographer at the *Starkville Daily News*, Martin/Marty is completing his second year as a teacher at Alexander Attendance Center. Marty's stage debut was in last fall's SCT production of *Life with Father*. He served as production assistant in last spring's *The Nerd*.
- MARSHA WILLIAMS (Sophie) Another SCT veteran, Marsha has served as assistant director of several shows including *Tintypes* and *The Philadelphia Story*, as director of *Harvey*, and on stage in *Wait Until Dark*, *The Octette Bridge Club*, *A Bad Year for Tomatoes*, and *Life With Father* among others. A research assistant at MSU's Social Science Research Center, she is the mother of Steven (20), a junior at the University of Wisconsin-Madison; Rowan (11), a fifth-grader at Rosa Stewart Elementary School; and Kyle (8), a second-grader at Overstreet Elementary.
- GREG BENTLEY (Maurice) A native Californian, Greg is an assistant professor of English at MSU, where he teaches Shakespeare and other, lesser writers. Since arriving in Starkville four years ago, he has been among SCT's most active members. His most exciting previous role was the amorous half-wit, Piney, in A Bad Year for Tomatoes (1988). His other on-stage appearances have included Critics' Choice and Same Time Next Year.
