A BRIEF SYNOPSIS OF ACT ONE Time: the nineteen-fifties

"Vada Love Powell, the self-appointed doyenne of a small Southern town, has invited Mary Lou Mele to tea. It's Vada's intention to scare off another prospective bride for her beloved son, Apple, but she meets her match in Mary Lou, who's pretending to be her twin sister, Mary Ann, whom Apple secretly married that very afternoon.

In scene two, Vada must face her best friends, Marybell Baxter and Enid Symonds, in Enid's tree house, where the three gather to 'play canasta and consume sweets.' Marybell and Enid agree that Vada 'had this one coming,' but Vada pretends that nothing untoward or out of the ordinary has happened. It's a complete surprise when Apple returns with his shy bride, who astounds even Vada with her love for him.

Act Two begins ten years later.
