From the Director

Finally the frantic pace of rehearsals, costume and prop making and gathering, set building and painting, and the set dressing is over. The musical that seemed impossible to stage is ready. The crew has painstakingly researched the historical aspects of the entire show. Even the bicycle is a European model of one made in 1909.

Now you can sit in the audience and share the joy that I've had for so many nights of preparation. *She Loves Me* has cast and crew members who are professional people, well established in our community, while others are still in college and just starting out. All involved in this show are amazing people, who carry their load of responsibilities with a smile on their faces and a supportive attitude. How fortunate I have been to work with all of this wonderful cast and crew.

The setting is Budapest in 1935, before the World War II Nazi Invasion of Hungary. Although the musical is bright and cheerful, the underneath message is that the economy was precarious and people did not want to lose their jobs. The storyline is based on an old Hungarian tale, and the music and lyrics were written by the same men who wrote *Fiddler on the Roof. She Loves Me* opened on Broadway in 1963 and was revived in 1993. I fell in love with musical when we saw it in London in 1994.

Without the dedication and skills of Set Designer and builder, plus Light and Sound Director, Edwin Ellis, the complicated set would not have been possible. Sue Snow and Sue Helms have costumed fifteen people with complete outfits and some with more than one. Every attention to detail has been addressed. Evelyn Lowery reached out to the community for props. Madeline and Cherri Golden are in charge of the multitude of prop items on the set. Zack Ford and Zak Mayo doubled as characters and set change crew. To Brad Moreland, Thomas La Foe, and Pattye Archer, you have gone the extra mile with the set decorating. Thanks, Diane Ellis, for your artwork on the set. Bonnie Oppenheimer, who is my "right hand," can also read my mind! She is tireless in her duties as Assistant Director. Carole Sorenson, the Music Director, has whipped the difficult music in place, and plays during the show, behind the black curtain. To each of the crew and to my talented group of actors, I offer my heartiest "Thank you" for a job well done. And to my husband, Don Mabry, I appreciate the Budapest pictures and your taking care of things at home so I can go to play rehearsals.
